Beach Watch Training



The Farallones Marine Sanctuary Association in partnership with NOAA's Gulf of the Farallones National Marine Sanctuary needs volunteer citizen scientists to help collect data used to assess the condition of our shores along the Sonoma and southern Mendocino coasts. During monthly surveys Beach Watch volunteers monitor an assigned beach segment counting, identifying, and photodocumenting live and dead birds and marine mammals and human activity along the coast. We are now adding survey sites northward, to the Point Arena area.

Join one of our 2014 Fall Training Classes:

We will host two training classes this fall: Bodega Bay Oct. 16-19 and Gualala Nov. 6-9. To become a Beach Watch volunteer you must attend one of two orientations, be 18 years old, attend all required training, and commit to surveying your beach once every four weeks for a minimum of one year. Some knowledge of local birds and marine mammals is highly encouraged.
